Concept Note

Mahatma Gandhi is a symbol of the power of powerlessness. His strength was based on truth and non-violence (Satya and Ahimsa). On almost all aspects Gandhi's thinking was a perfect blend of tradition and modernity. He understood the importance of change but knew very well that cultural roots were equally important for a nation. To uproot colonialism Gandhi wanted to unite all classes of India. Although he laid emphasis on tradition yet he was not socially conservative. His socio-political thought was constructed upon the progressive ideals of the empowerment of women and dalits. Mahatma Gandhi was not only fighting for freedom from colonialism but also liberation of the mind and building of India with secular values. He emphasized upon the importance of economic self-reliance that includes the flourishing of rural India. The method of non-violence gave the national struggle for freedom the scope to be a mass-movement. Gandhian philosophy can be termed as humanist rationalism and universal brotherhood blended together. By bringing the poor, untouchable, minorities and women in the mainstream society Mahatma Gandhi propagated the values of self-reliance, Swadesi and equality. This webinar intends to discuss the thought and legacy of Mahatma Gandhi with the following **sub-themes**:

- **Truth and Non-violence in Gandhian thought**
- **The concept of self-reliance**
- **Gandhi's conception of rural India**
